Dear IEHS Members and JAEH Subscribers:

As editor, it is my privilege to pass along much exciting news involving the *Journal of American Ethnic History*. For the past few years, the electronic version of the journal was available to subscribers through the History Cooperative. Commencing in 2011, current issues of the JAEH in electronic format will now be made available to current individual and institutional subscribers via the new Current Scholarship Program sponsored by JSTOR. The journal will continue to be published by the University of Illinois Press, and back issues will still be available through JSTOR's Arts & Sciences V Collection.

Decreasing university support and increased publication and distribution costs, including higher fees to mount current issues of the journal online, have made these difficult times for scholarly journals. The editors of the journal and the officers of the Immigration and Ethnic History Society are nonetheless hopeful that our new partnership with JSTOR, together with the continuing support of our subscribers, will enable the journal to reach a wider scholarly and public audience while ensuring that the valuable content of the journal will continue to be available to students, scholars, and teachers for many years to come.

We are especially enthusiastic about journal features that will appear within the upcoming year. The Summer 2010 issue of the journal will be a special issue, guest-edited by Professor Horacio Roque Ramírez, on "Homoerotic, Lesbian and Gay Ethnic and Immigrant Histories." Another special issue, guest edited by Professor Ieva Zake and now in preparation, will examine "American Ethnic Groups and Cold War Politics." The journal also has scheduled a forum on "Teaching Race through Fiction and Memoir." These and other articles, essays, and special features continue to mark the *Journal of American Ethnic History* as a superior scholarly publication and the leading journal in the U.S. immigration and ethnic history field.
